"Before everybody gets caught up in the holidays, they should make their reservations for Las Vegas" Annual Membership Meeting Chairman, Dave Shea, advises.

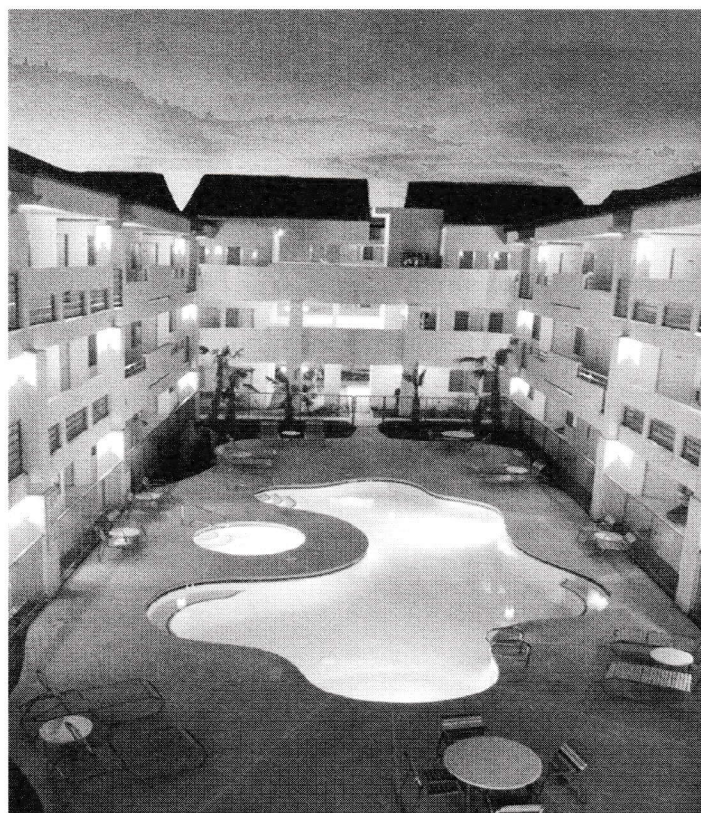

They didn't know his name but they looked forward to his visits. To Special Forces Units in Vietnam in 1967-68 he was the 'Flying Circus,' a U-10 that circled their camps after broadcasting messages and dropping leaflets on psychological warfare missions to boost their morale with calliope music.

That's when I met Ralph Evans. He commanded an Air Commando outfit at Bien Hoa and I was the Public Affairs Officer. Ralph was a PAO, too, but as so many pilots he was put back in the cockpit. He was a real help to me in a variety of ways – willing to help with media flights and always a good sounding board.

Ralph was a real friend of all young PAOs as I learned over the years whenever I met someone who had served under him. His career ended

in 1977 when he retired as a Lt. Colonel from the base PAO slot at Wright-Patterson AFB.

When he joined the Air Force Public Affairs Alumni Association, I called and urged him to join us in Colorado Springs. That's when I learned of his lengthy battle with cancer.

He said he couldn't make that one but would do his best to make it to Hampton. He did just that, and we had a chance to hoist a few together. He looked great, and I believe he really enjoyed himself as he renewed some old friendships.

Ralph died in Fawcett Memorial Hospital, Port Charlotte, Florida on October 3. He is survived by his wife, Lillian.

We have lost a good friend and a kind man.

Robert A. Webb

Lt. Colonel Robert A. Webb died of cancer on October 13 at his home in Roanoke, Virginia.

As a young lieutenant he was a bombardier/navigator who flew 30 missions, including supporting the D-Day invasion, in 8th Air Force B-24s in 1944.

After the war he served as an Information Officer in Tactical Air Command, at the Air Force Academy, in SAF/PA, and DoD Public Affairs.

While assigned to SAF/PA he assisted in writing the scripts for films made for the retirements of Generals Thomas D. White, Nathan Twining, and Curtis Lemay.

Among his decorations

were the Distinguished Flying Cross with Oak Leaf Cluster and the Air Medal with five Oak Leaf Clusters.

After his retirement in 1968, he operated several book stores and tobacco stores in Roanoke and in Washington.

After an incident in which his home garage blew up as a result of a leaking gas tank, Bob could brag that he logged more time on a flying garage door than any other pilot in the Air Force.

He is survived by his wife, Sarah – know as 'Izzy' or 'Rachel' to his friends – and by a daughter, Tuggy McClure.

Nebraska State Historical Society Oldfield Exhibit

The Nebraska State Historical Society honored two of its own – Vada & Barney Oldfield – when it opened a new exhibit at the Museum of Nebraska History in Lincoln, September 27.

The exhibit, 'Believe It or Not® The Lives & Times of Vada & Col. Barney Oldfield,' features items from an eclectic array of artifacts they gathered in their lifetime.

In addition to the artifacts, the couple have donated two condominiums and cash to the Nebraska State Historical Society Foundation. The appraised value of their latest gifts exceeds \$500,000, but the historical value is incalculable, according to Jeanne Bishop, executive director of the foundation.

Among the items are one of Adolph Hitler's personal books. It was 'liberated' from the rubble of the Nazi leader's office by Barney, who was one of the first Americans to enter Berlin after its capture in 1945.

In addition to acquiring the book, while in the bombed-out office he took the opportunity to express his feelings about the Fuhrer by relieving himself on Adolph's desk.

Personal correspondence between Barney and Presidents Eisenhower, Reagan, and Bush also were given to the society.

Other items included books with the signatures of authors such as Ernest Hemingway, Julia Childs, and Walter Cronkite; and dressing room passes from fights involving Barney's longtime friend, former world heavyweight boxing champion, George Foreman.

One of the condominiums

the couple donated is in Lincoln's University Towers, directly below the penthouse University Club where Barney once worked as a 35-cents-an-hour bus boy. It is filled with mementos and will be used by the society for special events.

The second condominium is the one they call home in Los Angeles. When it is sold, an endowment will be established to finance a number of things, including bringing prominent scholars to speak at the society's annual conferences and providing stipends for student historical study activities.

The Oldfield's gifts are an extension of their lifelong commitment to education.

AFPAAA's Chairman Mike McRaney observed, "Barney and Vada are two of the most famous people in the world of public relations. Barney's contributions to Air Force Public Affairs are impossible to measure and his generosity to many worthwhile causes is legendary."

While many people are familiar with Barney's activities as a Hollywood press agent, his World War II exploits, subsequent careers in the United States Air Force and with Litton, few are aware of what Vada did.

She was an original member of the Women's Auxiliary Army Corps and later the Women's Army Corps. During WWII she served in Africa, Sicily, and Italy.

Vada and Barney met while they were students at the University of Nebraska. They have been married since 1935.

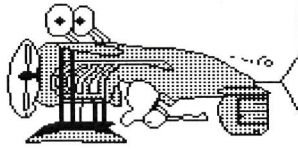
