Ross Named AFPAAA Board Secretary For Mullaney's Term

Cecil F. 'Bud' Ross is the new secretary of the Air Force Public Affairs Alumni Association. Bud was named to the post in January by the board of directors when Pat Mullaney had to step down because of the workload of his job. Bud is no stranger to AFPAAA. He is a Life Member and has been our public relations chairman for

three years. Bud will serve as a member of the board for the 18 months remaining in Pat's term.

"I'm honored to have been chosen for this position and given the opportunity to serve our retired public affairs community," he said. "Equally important, this is a critical time of rebuilding the career field following dramatic personnel cuts and I think AFPAAA can be of help in that quest."

A 1968 graduate of Officer Training School, his career included public affairs duty at Hamilton, Griffiss, Andrews, Randolph, Sheppard, and Scott Air Force



Bases, and at Lajes Field and Clark Air Base. Bud last served as dual director of public affairs for the U. S. Transportation and Air Mobility Commands during the first Gulf War and the Somalia and Bosnian relief efforts. He retired as a colonel in 1993.

After his Air Force career he became the publisher of the O'Fallon Progress Newspaper in O'Fallon, IL. Bud returned to his home state of California to accept the position of president of the Fairfield-Suisun Chamber of Commerce in 1999, a post he held until retiring in 2002.

Bud brings extensive experience in volunteer organizations to AFPAAA, serving as president of Friends of Scott AFB; a past chairman and current board member of the Travis Regional Armed Forces Committee; is vice chairman of the Travis Community Consortium and a board member of the Northern California Retired Officers Community, the governing body for Paradise Valley Estates Retirement Community in Fairfield, CA.

Elections - Vote Below For Five Board Members

The AFPAAA Board of Directors has 11 elected members who serve overlapping two-year terms. Five positions are open this year for terms beginning July 1, 2009 and ending June 30, 2011. Only Full Members in good standing may vote. To be counted, all ballots must reach the Election Committee by Friday, April 10, 2009. The candidates are below; provisions are made for a write-in vote but ballots may only be cast for four persons. Neil Buttimer has been AFPAAA's membership director since 1994. He maintains the membership roster, handles new members and renewals, publishes the annual membership directory and monitors the Association's mail box in Locust Grove, VA. Neil is seeking his second term on the AFPAAA Board. He retired from the Air Force as a colonel in 1991 after holding a variety of Public Affairs jobs. He worked for almost ten years as a contractor in the missile defense organization's public and legislative office at the Pentagon. Neil received a BA in Broadcasting from Southern Illinois University and an MA in Mass Communications from the University of Denver. He currently is on the board of directors of his 4,200-lot homeowners association. Neil is a Lifetime Founder and was one of the original organizers of AFPAAA.

Alan DeFend capped a 28-year Air Force career in 1998 as Public Affairs Deputy Director. He began as the Deputy Chief of Information at Barksdale's 2nd Bomb Wing in 1969. Subsequent assignments took him to Incirlik, McConnell, Chanute, Hickam, and Washington. He served in various public affairs and recruiting positions including base and center PA chief, AMC and USTRANSCOM PA Director, and OASD(PA) Director for Community Relations. After completing military service, Alan served briefly as a FEMA Public Affairs Reservist and USA Today consultant, and later as the Director of Administration and Research for the Advisory Commission on Electronic Commerce. He served for more than five years as Vice President for Public Affairs for the American Health Care Association and has lectured on military-media relations at the Inter-American Defense College in Washington. He holds a Bachelor of Journalism



from the University of Missouri and a Masters in management from Webster College and is a graduate of the Air War College.

Sam Giammo is the president of AFPAAA and, if elected, will become chairman of its board of directors July 1. He completed his 27-year Air Force career in Public Affairs as SAF/PA deputy director. Sam is now the director of Public Affairs for the University of New Mexico Health Sciences Center in Albuquerque. He is the immediate past chair of the New Mexico Ronald McDonald House Charities Board of Directors and is a member of the advisory board for the New Mexico Mothers Against Drunk Drivers. He has a BA in Journalism from Kent State University and an MA in communication from the University of Northern Colorado. He is accredited in public relations by the Public Relations Society of America and a member of the PRSA College of Fellows.



C. B. Kelly, after graduation from Providence College with a BA in Education, entered the Air Force Aviation Cadet Program and became a navigator on MATS transports. He flew from Kelly and Charleston AFBs until assigned to Lajes AB, Azores, where General E. B. LeBailey got him interested in the Information field. Before becoming an IO, he had AFROTC assignments at Georgetown University and Maxwell AFB, where as a captain, he was the AFROTC Director of Information. He then went to Vietnam as a Wing Information Officer. He was assigned to the Pentagon, working for Bill Greener and Bill Coleman. His final tour before retiring in 1977 was three plus years heading SAFOI-LA. C.B. then worked in public affairs for ARCO for fifteen years. He was a woodcarver for forty years. Now he enjoys scuba diving and travel as a passenger on freight ships (but pirates have curtailed freighter travel).





Christine Queen is vice president and a Lifetime Founder of AFPAAA and, if re-elected, will become president on July 1. She has a BS degree in education from Illinois State University. Christine was the third PAO in country for Desert Shield ('90) and the first PAO for the President's Counternarcotics Operation in Puerto Rico. In the Pentagon, she was Chief, Plans and Programs, Ballistic Missile Defense Organization (now Missile Defense Organization). She was 2nd Air Force Director of Public Affairs, Beale AFB, and Chief of Advertising and Publicity for the recruiting squadron at Lowry AFB. She retired in 1998. Christine is a lifetime member of AFA, ROA, and the MOAA. She was a board member of the MOAA Peoria, IL, chapter from 2004-2006. Bored with retirement, Christine is looking for part-time convention and marketing opportunities.



Mark H. Gilman

Mark Gilman, whose career in and out of uniform with the Army Air Corps and the United States Air Force spanned four decades, died of a heart attack February 19. He was 92. Born in Bridgeton, New Jersey, he attended Stanford University which

he left to join the Army Air Corps. After getting his wings in late 1942, he flew B-17s from Bassingbourn, England. Later in the war he and his crew returned to the United States for a War Bond drive.

After the war he flew in the Berlin Airlift and with Strategic Air Command. He moved into the Information career field with assignments that included recruiting service, USAFE Director of Information, SAF/OIs Public Information Division Chief, and as Assistant Director



of Information, a post he held until retiring from active duty as a colonel in 1969. He returned immediately to SAF/OI in the same job which had been converted to a civilian position; he retired once again in 1975.

Mark is survived by his wife of 53 years, Dottie, with whom he traveled extensively in retirement until the onset of Alzheimer's disease. He is also survived by their son Robin and his wife Lynn; grandchildren, Robert and Lauren; and great grandchild Reef.

Art Jungwirth whose warm smile brightened any room and 'can do' attitude was infectious, passed away in December

after battling lung cancer. He was 68. Born in Dubuque, Iowa, he served in the Army as a Spec 4. He graduated from Colorado State University with a commission from Air Force ROTC in 1966. His Public Affairs assignments included Lowry, Seymour Johnson, and Peterson AFBs; RAF Upper Heyford and Ruislip; and Yongson AB, Korea. He also served a tour as a missile launch officer at Ellsworth AFB. Art retired in



1986 as a Lieutenant Colonel at Randolph AFB where he was Deputy Director of Public Affairs for Air Training Command. He then became marketing director of the IMAX Theaters in San Antonio. 
Allan 'Red' Viguerie
