

Arturo 'Art' Aviles

Art Aviles, who had a 20-year Air Force career as a pilot and a Public Affairs Officer, and an equally successful business career, passed away peacefully in his home in Huntington Beach, California, on January 7. He was 84.

He was born in Los Angeles and graduated from Loyola University and received a commission as an Air Force officer in

1956. He completed training and became a B-47 Stratojet pilot. He safely ejected when the engine of a B-47 he was flying in 1963 caught fire and the aircraft blew up. That accident led him into Public Affairs.

While recovering from his injuries he became a SAC General's Aide and duty as an Information Officer at Davis-Monthan AFB, Arizona.

Art's later assignments included flying 150 missions in KC-135s and B-52s, and being a Forward Air Controller in Vietnam. He flew the EC-135 Airborne Command Post from RAF Mildenhall AB, England, and was the commander of Chievres AB, Belgium, SHAPE Headquarters. He accumulated more that 6,000 flight hours in bombers, fighters, transports, and helicopters.

He was assigned to Headquarters SAC as Deputy Chief of Public Affairs in 1972 and later became 8th Air Force Chief of Public Affairs. He turned down promotion to colonel for family reasons and retired in 1976 as a lieutenant colonel.

In retirement, Art entered the life insurance industry and soon became the Mutual Trust Life Insurance Company's District Manager for Los Angeles and Orange Counties. Nine years

later he left the insurance industry and established Art Aviles and Associates Business Development Consultants serving companies desiring to conduct business with the U.S. military. He was very community and civic minded, selflessly volunteering his time to help grow organizations, corporations, hospitals and other entities.

Art is survived by his wife, Roxana; five children, Roxy, Art Jr., Robert, Cecilia, and Diana; ten grandchildren and three great grandchildren.

I will always remember Art as a charismatic leader and role model who had a profound impact on my Air Force career. We first met when I was a brand new 2nd Lt. at Offutt AFB, Neb. He took me under his wing and showed me how be an officer and public affairs professional. He was a sharp looking, ramrod straight officer, movie star handsome with a penetrating gaze that could look right through you. I carried his words of wisdom and advice throughout my career. Thank you, Art, for your service, friendship

and example of what it means to be an officer.

Dick Abel's New Book An Easy, Insightful Read

AFPAAA member Dick Abel's latest book, *GPS For Leaders Of Excellence*, is different. It is not a story or a textbook, nor is not a biography. Yet it has a lot to offer.

Perhaps the best way to describe this short book is to call it a form of 'checklist' for those who are or will be in positions of leadership.

But, it is not a typical checklist where you follow a progression of actions to ensure they have been accomplished and when you have done them all you are ready to perform the larger task those actions lead to.

Dick's checklist is rather unique. He has taken the words of well known great leaders, as well as positive concepts of management, character, and personal relationships, that support the thesis leadership is all about how you communicate with and treat people.

Using the idea that a GPS will correct you when you are off course, each of the chapters is labeled a "Vector Corrector" in chronological order from 2010-2017.

Because of the chapter dating and the labeling of each item in the chapters some people might assume the material in the book is dated – not so, readers will find the opposite. The chapter sub headings of Servant Leader, Compassion,


Delegation, Teamwork, Integrity ,Discipline, Communication, and Love are the key to the content which is quite current and will be in the future.

Each chapter in Dick's checklist is a collection of vi-

gnettes of wisdom to which he adds his own comments. They should be read a few at a time, then pondered in terms of the readers's self perception as well as their relationships and dealings with others, especially those they supervise.

Dick's latest work is deceptively simple in presentation but there is a lot more substance in it than it would seem at first glance, which makes it a worthwhile read.



Dick Abel has served four terms on the board. An internationally known speaker on family values, military affairs, and moral leadership and author of Leadership Is ALL About People, he is president of the instructional program of the same title, a seminar for people who desire to impact the lives of others. He is also ambassador at large and executive director emeritus of Military Ministry, a division of Campus Crusade International. A retired Air Force brigadier general and jet pilot, during his 30-year military career, he led an Air Force acrobatic team, was an assistant football coach at the U.S. Air Force Academy, escorted home five flights of returning POWs from Vietnam, served as special assistant to three four-star Navy admirals and one chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, and was director of Air Force Public Affairs.



Brett Ashworth served 21 years as an Air Force public affairs officer at the wing, DRU, MAJCOM, joint and Air Staff levels. He served as public affairs officer at Whiteman Air Force Base and Director of Public Affairs at the U.S. Air Force Academy. He also served as commander of the 344th Recruiting Squadron. He retired in 2014 from the Pentagon where he was Director of Air Force Media Operations. Upon military retirement he assumed the role of Vice President of Communications and Marketing at The Citadel. Brett became Vice Chancellor of Communications and Marketing at the Texas Tech University System in October of 2016. He, his wife Katy, and their 15-year-old triplets reside in Lubbock, Texas. His many deployments included duty as chief of press desk operations for the International Security Assistance Force, Kabul, Afghanistan, and as principal military spokesman for CJTF Operation Inherent Resolve in Iraq. John retired from active duty in 2017. He and his wife Valerie reside in Mount Pleasant, SC. They have 3 sons, Jay, Nicholas and Ryan.



John Gura is a Lifetime Founder who served as AFPAAA's 3rd President and Board Chairman. In 1997 He created and continues to provide support for the AFPAAA web site and Oral History Program. He has also chaired five Annual Meetings, John spent 21 years as a USAF Public Affairs Officer, holding wing, MAJCOM, SAF/PA and Joint jobs, including stints as Chief of the Chicago field office and Department Director and Deputy Commander of DINFOS. He retired in 1983. Subsequently, he worked in corporate marketing and production positions until 2000 when he helped found HomeSafe Environmental, Inc., a California environmental training and testing firm where he serves as President.



Doug Kennett is an AFPAAA Lifetime Founder. He has 30 years experience as an Air Force Public Affairs Officer and 14 as a senior Boeing Spokesman. From 1967-74 he headed Public Affairs at bases in Texas, Korea, and England.
